Sanxingdui Museum

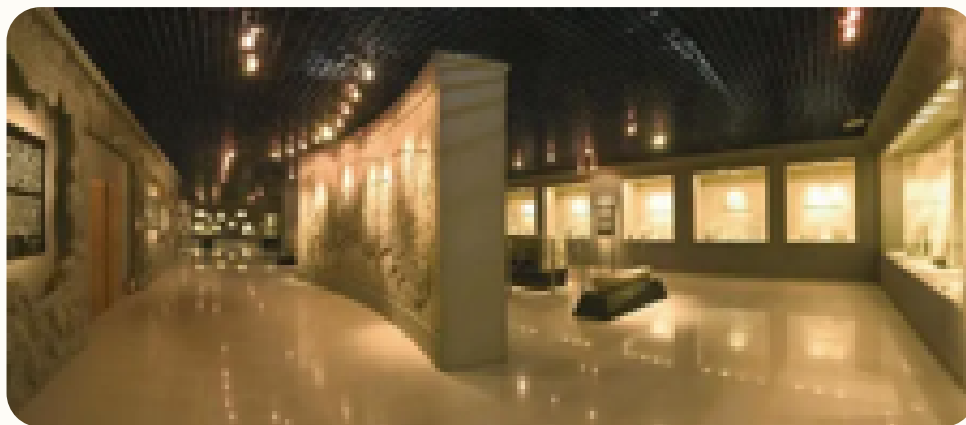


A national-level museum and a 4A-rated heritage attraction, it is located in the northeastern corner of the Sanxingdui Ruins, about 40 kilometres from Chengdu. It is also included in the national museum annual reporting system. The exhibition halls showcase national treasures such as the Bronze Sacred Tree, the Gold Mask, and the Bronze Standing Figure. These extraordinary artefacts feature unique and imaginative designs, providing compelling evidence of the independent and sophisticated civilization of ancient Shu.

Sichuan Museum



The largest provincial-level comprehensive museum in southwest China and a national first-class museum, it houses more than 350,000 cultural artefacts spanning Sichuan's history from ancient times to the present day. Set within a tranquil park, the museum offers free admission (reservations must be made in advance). It serves as the premier destination for understanding the rich history and cultural heritage of the Sichuan region.

Wu Hou Shrine



Wu Hou Shrine is a national first-class museum and a 4A-rated scenic attraction. The site encompasses cultural relics, historic temples, Liu Bei's Mausoleum, and the Three Kingdoms Cultural Zone. It is home to the renowned Tang Dynasty Three Treasures Stele and Han Dynasty stone sculptures from Sichuan. Its iconic red walls and bamboo groves create a distinctly Chinese atmosphere. Adjacent to Jinli Ancient Street, the shrine seamlessly blends the history of the Three Kingdoms with ancient architecture and traditional garden design, making it one of the world's most renowned landmarks of Three Kingdoms culture.

DuFu Cottage



Du Fu, one of the most celebrated poets of the Tang Dynasty and revered as the "Sage of Chinese Poetry," took refuge in Chengdu after fleeing Chang'an (now Xi'an). With the help of his friends, he built a thatched cottage beside Huanhua Stream in the western suburbs of Chengdu, where he spent four years of his life and composed more than 240 poems. Beginning in the Song Dynasty, people constructed gardens and halls on the site of his former residence to honour his legacy and pay tribute to him.

Wenshu Monastery



Wenshu Monastery is a Buddhist temple built during the Sui Dynasty. It is said that prayers and wishes made here are especially effective. Opposite the monastery is Wenshu Fang, a pedestrian street lined with traditional architecture. The area features tea houses, restaurants, handicraft workshops, market stalls, street performers, and even music bars, offering visitors a vibrant blend of culture, cuisine, and local craftsmanship.

Dachimei Temple



Dating back more than 1,600 years, the ancient temple is renowned as "the First Buddhist Monastery in China." Before embarking on his journey to the West, Xuanzang received his ordination and delivered sermons here. Located in the bustling Taikoo Li business district, the temple's ancient red walls stand in striking contrast to the surrounding modern shopping malls. Admission is free, and the ancient trees, meditation hall, and charming monk sculptures make it a popular spot for photography. Visitors can also enjoy affordable banban tea and vegetarian meals while experiencing a peaceful retreat amid the city's vibrant atmosphere.

Kuanzhai xiangzi Alleys



Listed as part of the Chengdu Historical and Cultural Protection Project, the Kuanzhaixiangzi Alleys comprise Kuanzhai Alley, Zhai Alley, and Jing Alley, and are home to numerous traditional siheyuan (courtyard houses). Once the residence of many prominent historical figures, these centuries-old alleys have been carefully restored and reopened to the public. Today, they are among Chengdu's most popular tourist destinations, offering a unique blend of history, culture, shopping, and local cuisine.

Jinli Ancient Street



Located next to the Temple of Marquis, Jinli is a reconstructed trading and folk art street designed in the traditional architectural style of western Sichuan. The original Jinli was one of the oldest and most prosperous commercial streets in the history of Shu. Today, the revitalized Jinli captures the essence of Chengdu's vibrant local life, with its teahouses, inns, restaurants, bars, theatres, handicraft shops, and stalls serving traditional snacks and local specialties.

Luada Ancient Town



A 4A-rated national scenic attraction, this is the best-preserved Hakka ancient town in Chengdu. According to legend, it was named after Liu Zhan dropped a jade belt here. The historic core is centred around "one street and seven lanes" and features four national Hakka guild halls, including those of Guangdong and Huguang. Its distinctive firewalls and architecture reflect the unique Lingnan style. Open to the public free of charge, the ancient town offers visitors an opportunity to experience the rich Hakka culture brought to Sichuan by migrants from Huguang.

Anren Ancient Town



Anren Ancient Town is a national museum town with a history spanning more than 1,300 years. It is renowned for its collection of well-preserved modern-era mansion complexes. The old street features 27 historic buildings, each more than a century old, showcasing a blend of Chinese and Western architectural styles. Complemented by the nostalgic charm of vintage trolley cars, the town is home to two major cultural landmarks: the Liu Family Estate and the Jianchuan Museum. The town is open to the public free of charge, while admission to the museums requires separate tickets. It offers visitors a unique combination of modern history, cultural exploration, and leisurely sightseeing.

Jiesi Ancient Town



A national 4A-rated scenic attraction, the thousand-year-old Jiangcheng Street has preserved its traditional Qing Dynasty residences. A river flows through the town, with ancient bridges dotting the landscape. Nearby, Guangyan Zen Monastery houses rare Ming Dynasty scriptures. The ancient town is open to the public free of charge throughout the day. Local specialties, such as Chuzu Noodles and Ye'era Papaya, are popular with visitors. Surrounded by mountains and waterways, the town offers a peaceful atmosphere, making it an ideal destination for a relaxing summer getaway just outside the city.
